

Your VSP® network eye doctor is a key part of your healthcare team, especially if you are living with diabetes or prediabetes.



Visit your eye doctor right away if you:

- See little black lines or spots that don't go away.
- Experience any red spots or fog.
- Have a sudden change in how clearly you see.
- Have trouble seeing colors.
- Take longer than usual to adjust to darkness.¹



Common eye diseases among people with diabetes:

- Diabetic retinopathy can cause blindness if not treated.
- Cataracts are more common in people with diabetes.
- Glaucoma can lead to vision loss or blindness if left untreated.¹



Healthy eyes to-do list:

- Talk to your eye doctor about receiving a retinal screening. They can take photos of the inside of your eyes to help assess any changes over time.
- Ask your eye doctor for advice about the best ways to keep your eyes healthy, and request that all test results are sent to your other healthcare providers.
- Manage your diabetes and work with your diabetes care team to reach your blood sugar targets.
